

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

- 1 There will be registration of individual plants for judging at this show, and these plants will be placed in sections for judging by the stewards. Exhibitors may not place plants within the show.
- 2 This show will not include any landscape competition.
- 3 Plants will be officially labelled at registration, but it is important that exhibitors correctly identify and label/name their plants before registration, to avoid delays. Only valid names will be accepted for plant entries. Trade names are allowed only for cut flower entries.
- 4 All plants for the competition must be registered online. Online plant registration will open on **28 August 0800 hours to 4 September 2359 hours.**
- The link to online registration website is orchidshow.ossea.org.sg. Upon successful registration, a unique number will be generated for the plant and the plant should be tagged with that number (exhibitor's own tag).
- 6 Plants with the registration numbers securely tagged are to be delivered to Tanglin Mall on 5th September from 1000 to 2000 hours.
- 7 In order to avoid congestion at the delivery point, you may pre-book a delivery time by email to OSSEA1928@gmail.com. Whilst OSSEA will attempt to assist to allow delivery as requested, OSSEA reserves the right to appoint a time to facilitate smooth delivery of all plants for the competition.
- Whilst the times stated for registration and delivery should be strictly complied with, if for some unforeseen reason you are unable to comply with the times, you may apply to OSSEA for an extension of time setting out your reasons for the delay by email to OSSEA1928@gmail.com. Your request will be considered by the Chief of Judging, whose decision shall be final and no further appeal will be entertained.
- 9 **Cut flower entries** are to be submitted only on 6 September 2019 from 9am to 12 noon.
- 10 Judging will commence on 6 September from 1600 hours.
- 11 The Show will be officially opened on 7th Sept (10am to 10pm) and will remain open to the public until 15th Sept (10am to 9 pm).
- 12 Plants may be reclaimed on 15th Sept (After 9pm)
- 13 OSSEA Perpetual Trophies will be presented to winners at the Official Opening of the Orchid Show.
- 14 Winners may not retain the OSSEA Perpetual Trophies.
- 15 The Show Organisers may remove or replace plants or flowers unable to last the full duration of the show. Exhibitors whose plants are removed from the display will be notified.

RULES

- 1. Entries are invited from all interested persons and parties subject to acceptance at the Registration Desk. There is no entry fee.
- 2. Entries for cut flowers (Class 52-54) are open only to members of SOGA (Singapore Orchid Growers' Association). A maximum of 45 entries will be accepted (each entry to consist of 10 stalks).
- 3. Exhibitors may enter exhibits in their name, or under a pseudonym. Corporate or organisational names are allowed. Joint entries are not allowed.
- 4. Exhibitors will be considered amateur or professional/commercial. An amateur is a hobby grower whose winning will not benefit or be thought to benefit a professional or commercial grower. Spouses and close family members of professional or commercial growers may not exhibit as amateurs.
- 5. Judging will be by invited Judges only and will commence at **4pm on 6 Sept**. Exhibitors will not be permitted in the area while judging is in progress.
- 6. Judges will only consider registered competitive plants.
- 7. Trophies and ribbons will be awarded. Trophies are awarded at the discretion of Judges to worthy winners. Ribbons are awarded for first, second and third placing within classes. In addition, entries from amateurs that did not win any placing ribbons (1st, 2nd, 3rd) will be eligible for award of Judges' Commendation Ribbons. Up to 20 may be awarded at the discretion of Judges.

- 8. A plant may receive more than one award.
- 9. The judges may at their discretion withhold any award if exhibited plants are considered unworthy.
- 10. There is no separate class/award for orchids with decorative foliage. Any foliage orchid will be put in the appropriate class for its genus and judged along with blooming orchids in that class, but on the basis of the excellence of the foliage. Foliage orchids in bloom may alternatively be considered on the basis of their flowers at the discretion of judges.
- 11. The Chair of Judges has the authority to decide the class of entry of a particular plant.
- 12. To be eligible for the Yuen-Peng McNiece Challenge Cup, specimen plants should be single plants.
- Where more than one plant is in a pot or other container or mount, only the best will be judged. In the case of Papilionanthe and strongly terete Papilionandas, up to 5 plants (stems) may be included in the pot and will be judged as a group.
- 14. Stakes or wires must be unobtrusive, must not touch any part of any flower, including the pedicel, and must not extend beyond the first flower on any spray, except in the case of Phalaenopsis and Oncidium Alliance exhibits.
- 15. Disbudded plants, diseased plants and newly collected jungle plants are not to be exhibited. The pruning of side sprays on Phalaenopsis hybrids (not species) is acceptable.
- 16. No exhibit may be removed before the close of the Show without the permission of the Show Chair.
- 17. All submitted Orchids and plants will be handled with care and participants to participate at their own risk. The Show Committee and Cuscaden Properties Pte Ltd are not responsible for any loss, damaged, theft during registration, exhibition and the entire event period.
- 18. Any infringement of entry regulations and conditions may lead to the disqualification of the exhibit or exhibitor concerned. Any protest concerning such infringement or any other matter must be made to the Show Chair, whose decision shall be final.
